PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The General Technology (TEC) associate degree program allows the opportunity to combine fundamental general education courses with a technical specialty and a cross technology to form a degree program. Designed as a cross-disciplinary program, the General Technology degree allows the student to combine engineering technology, business technology or computer technology programs to meet individualized career goals.

ADMISSIONS

Students applying to the General Technology associate degree program must supply the following documentation before registering for courses:

- > An official copy of high school transcripts or Graduate Equivalency Diplomat (GED) transcripts. A certificate of completion will not be accepted as a substitute for a high school diploma or GED.
 - > All candidates for the General Technology associate degree program must take the COMPASS/ASSET placement evaluation unless they have official college transcripts with a “C” or better in Math for Business & Finance (MAT160) and English Composition I (ENG 101).
 - > Official transcripts must be sent from the issuing college directly to the Admissions Office at TCL via the mail.
 - > A copy of the high school or GED transcripts, COMPASS/ASSET placement evaluation, and/or college transcript must be at the TCL Admissions Office before a student can register.
 - > Students lacking these requirements may register as Career Development students but will not be admitted into the General Technology programs until all requirements are met.

1. Apply to the College and for Financial Aid.
 2. Complete the COMPASS and/or TEAS placement assessments.
 3. Call your academic advisor to make an appointment for advisement and to register.
 4. Pay your tuition and fees. (*Verify financial aid.*)
 5. Obtain all needed College IDs: Student ID, Vehicle Registration, and Blackboard ID. (*Get your books and course supplies.*)
 6. Mark your calendar for the first day of class and plan to be there!
